Reading One – God The Father

The Bible passages are long today, and I'm going to have to ask your help for one of them. I'll come to that in a minute. So we're going to begin with Psalm Sixty-eight, four to six. Sing to God, sing in praise of his name. Extoll him who rides on the clouds. Rejoice before him. His name is the Lord, a father to the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in His holy dwelling. God sets the lonely in families. He leads out the prisoners with singing but the rebellious live in a sun scorched land. Isaiah 49 to 11. You who bring good news to Zion go up on a high mountain. You who bring good news to Jerusalem, lift up your voice with a shout. Lift it up. Do not be afraid. Say to the towns of Judah. Here is your God. See, the sovereign Lord comes with power and he rules with a mighty arm. See, his reward is with him. And he his recompense accompanies him. He tends his flock like a shepherd. He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart. He gently leads those that have young. So Isaiah 40, 25 to 31, to whom will you compare me or who is my equals? Says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes and look at the heavens. Who created all these? He who brings out the starry host one by one, and calls forth each of them by name because of his great power and mighty strength. Not one of them is missing. Why do you complain, Jacob? Why do you say Israel? My way is hidden from the Lord. My cause is disregarded by my God Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the creator of the ends of the Earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom he gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary and young men stumble and fall, but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not be faint.

Now for my problem: Psalm 23. I love the King James version. You have to be a certain age to know the King James version. So I am hoping there are enough of you to help me out. I left my copy of The King James version at home and I would like to try and say it. So if I pause, or even if you want to say it with me, if you know it, please do so. Psalm 23. The Lord is my shepherd. I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness, for his name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil For thou art with me thy rod and thy staff, they comfort me. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies, thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy, will follow me all the days of my life. And I shall dwell in the house of the Lord, forever.

Reading Two – God The Son

Good morning. Good morning. Now, as Barbara said, we have a number of scriptures to read today. And this one is going to be John one, one to five. In the beginning was the word and the word was with God and the word was God. He was with God in the beginning, through him, all things were made without him. Nothing was made that has been made in him. Was life. And that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness. Just not understood it.

Okay. The next one is Matthew 11:27 to 30. All things have been committed to me by my father. No one knows the sun except the father. And no one knows the father except the sun and those to whom the sun chooses to reveal him. And then come to me. All you who are weary and burdened. And I will. Give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me. For I am gentle and humble and heart And you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.

And then First Corinthians -- Corinthians one, three, to five Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion. And the God of all comfort. Who comforts us in our troubles so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves have received from God. This fits so nicely with what we have just seen earlier on the screen. And so we are at 16 to 17 for God. So loved the world that He gave His one and only son that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life for God did not set of son send his son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. Thank you.

Communion

Remembrance. Yes, there's sometimes mixed connotations in terms of remembering. We think about this past week, the Queen's passing remembrance, 70 years of service, dedication, consistency, a model. And yet there's people who maybe don't have fond memories of the monarchy and the British Empire colonialization, slavery. So you come at it from different sides. September 11th, that's today. 21 years ago, the world changed. The World Trade Centers attacked. So to our young people here, if you're under 25, that date may not hold much significance to you. But I would venture to say that you've talked about it in history class. You've talked about it in some way as it impacts your life. And many of you flew here from Asia, from Africa in the last few weeks in your life on that plane was changed in terms of security because of what happened 21 years ago today. So we think about the reality of our world changing sometimes rather dramatically.

The remembrance of that event September 1st or September 11th, 2001, was sort of reinforced to me because for three years now I have not gone to Newfoundland, but I have been twice the summer conducting tours and even Janet and Martin were with me on the first trip. And what I do is I go to a little place called Louis Port because in Gander, when the airspace was shut down, 6500 people from around the world were were pushed to this little town to land in an airport, and then they were taken care of for a week. But think of the emotions of those people. Think of the emotions of our world at the time. Confusion, fear, anger. You know, just uncertainty. What's going on? And this little town of Gander received 6500 people. So what I do is in Louis Port, I pull over by the middle school in Louis Port because there was a lady who was one of those 6500 passengers that landed. And she and her colleagues were in Louis Port. And here in the midst of all this confusion and chaos and and just worry and fear and what's going on in our world, this little community responds with kindness, hospitality, goodness, comfort, love, concern. So in the midst of tragedy, in the midst of chaos and evil, comes compassion and kindness and goodness and love.

So I pull over because a lady by the name of Louise Felder and her colleagues ask simply, Is there any computers we can use? And they were directed to the middle school. A computer lab was opened up, and for the next six days they ran the Rockefeller Foundation from Louis part Middle School. Rockefeller Foundation gives away hundreds of millions of dollars a year. And they ran the Rockefeller Foundation from a little town in Newfoundland, quietly, without anybody knowing. But when they left, they presented the school, the principal, with a check for \$70,000 and said, maybe you should upgrade your computer lab. You know what? In the midst of craziness and tragedy came the celebration of goodness and kindness and hospitality. Another example from Newfoundland. On my last trip, just a few weeks ago, I went to the rooms, which is a provincial museum, and then it there is a permanent display because on July 1st, 1916, the battle at Beaumont Hamel took place and the Newfoundland Regiment was almost decimated. I've just got statistics. 780 young fighters got out of the trenches and

the next morning only 68 were called on the roll call. 110 survived, but only 68 showed up. One of the worst military slaughters in history. And so you see, if you're a Newfoundlanders who just joined Confederation 1949, you weren't even part of Canada when you went to that war. July 1st says some mixed messages, some mixed feelings, because July 1st is Canada's celebration our birthday. But it's also, to a Newfoundlanders, a sober reminder of the sacrifice of their young people in 1916.

So mixed messages. And as we come around the table this morning, we kind of are feeling that as well, because remembrance is about thinking about the unjustified death of our savior, the fact that he was wrongfully convicted, the fact that he did not deserve death, the fact that he stood for everything that was good, everything that was decent, everything that was lovely, everything that was caring about humanity. And yet mankind nailed him to a cross. It does not seem to be appropriate given who he was, what he stood for, what he did, and yet he died. He died a terrible death on the cross. And yet, if I remember, I don't just stop remembering that the deaths occurred. I must remember the purpose of his death. It was for my sins. For your sins, for our salvation. It wasn't just a a an accident. It wasn't just something that was happenstance. It was God's plan for mankind to redeem us because he loved us. He wanted us to be redeemed to him. And so as we meet around the table, we think about the fact that death was not the end, that if I remember his death, which we're commanded to do, we also recognize that he rose from the dead that is seated on the right hand with his father, that he has put implant in motion for us so that we too can be called his children, that we too can be redeemed and that we can have everlasting life with him. So the reality is remembrance is complicated whether we remember things happening in our world, which sometimes can serve as a good spiritual, even reminder to us. So when I go and walk through that gallery and I see the war and the suffering of from the First World War and the injustice and inhumanity from well, I think about also that when I come around the table, there was injustice.

But ultimately, God's plan is for us and for all mankind. And the reality is we are commanded. Jesus said, this is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me in the same way after supper you took the cup saying, This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this whenever you drink it in remembrance of me. For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until it comes.

Let's pray our father. We thank you for the love that prompted you to send Jesus into this world. We thank you for His care and concern for mankind that he was willing to see this plan through, even if it resulted in his own death.

But we father we are thankful that death was not the victor, that you overcame death by raising him from the dead. We thank you for the hope that we have because of his sacrifice and his resurrection. And we pray that you will help us as we partake of these emblems now to fully understand and comprehend the great love that was shown at the Cross, this is our prayer in Christ's name. Amen.

Reading Three – God The Holy Spirit

If You Love Me, Keep my commands and I will ask the Father and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever. The Spirit of Truth. The world cannot accept him because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him for he lives with you and will be in you. The spirit of the sovereign Lord is on me because the Lord is anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives, and release from

darkness for the prisoners to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and the day of vengeance. Our God to comfort all who mourn, to provide for those who grieve in Zion, to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy, instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair, they will be called orcs of righteousness, a planting of the Lord for the display of His splendor.

Therefore, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation what is not to the flesh to live according to it. For if you live according to the flesh, you will die. But if by the spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live for those who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. The Spirit you receive does not make you slaves so that you live in fear again. Rather, the spirit you received brought about your adoption to Sonship and by him. We cry Abba Father. The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit. Then we are God's children. Now, if we are children, then we're heirs, heirs of God and coworkers with Christ. If indeed we share in His sufferings, in order that we may also share in His glory. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace. I leave with you my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives you Do not let your hearts be troubles Do not be afraid But the spirit, the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control against such things there is no law.

Closing Prayer

Let us pray. Dear God in Heaven, we love you and thank you for giving us this opportunity to worship you. And we pray that in our private worship, our private times of reading your Bible and praying this week, that we will come to know you even better, and that that we will love you more each day. Thank you, God, for our church and thank you for all the people who are part of this church. But right now, thank you for the people who who are not able to be here today because of the infirmities that come with with age and thank you, God, for for Val and thank you for Len and Dorothy and Jo-Anne and Dorothy and Johnny and Jo and John and Connie and thank you God for Marie. And and we pray for her and Jack and thank you for the inspiration. All of these people have been to us over the years and for all that they have done to make us better people. And we pray God for the people who have not found their way back after all they did. We miss them and we love them. And we pray that that they will return at some point and that that we will be one group again.

And thank you, God, for the opportunities we have to serve you. And we pray that this week, as we go about our duties and that that we will do good works and that we will glorify you in who we are and in what we do, and that your name will be glorified because of who we are in Jesus name, amen.
